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## EJP Social Media Team

The mission of the Education Justice project is to build a model college-in-prison program that demonstrates the positive impacts of higher education upon incarcerated people, the communities from which they come, the host institution, and society as a whole.

EJP is looking for dynamic, organized, experienced, and results-driven individuals to serve on our new Social Media team. This position is based on campus. It is not necessary to seek prison clearance.

Members of the Spring 2023 SM Team will be responsible for writing and monitoring posts, and for establishing processes and systems to support EJP's social media needs, under the supervision of Marisa Peacock from the Sandage Social Media Lab. Please note that we hope successful applicants will wish to stay in the position beyond Spring 2023.

### **All team members are required to:**

- Attend regular team meetings and other meetings as required
- Take responsibility for projects and ownership to meet deadlines
- As members of EJP, team members are expected to take advantage of offered opportunities to learn about criminal justice and incarceration and to consider themselves a valued part of the wider EJP community

### **Position Requirements**

- Excellent writing skills
- At least one year's relevant experience
- Demonstrated understanding of and commitment to EJP's work and mission

### **Preferred Skills**

- Course work or degree in communications, marketing, media, or related field
- Experience in any capacity in an organization or campaign concerned with incarceration or reentry.

Team members typically work between 5 – 10 hours/week on average.

### **Compensation**

\$15/hour for undergraduate students.
